

TRUTH and RECONCILIATION WEEK

This year Truth and Reconciliation Week runs from September 22 to 26. It is an opportunity for all communities to engage with the history and enduring spirit of First Nations, Inuit and Métis peoples.

TRUTH and RECONCILIATION/ORANGE SHIRT DAY



Each year, September 30 marks the National Day for Truth and Reconciliation. We do not have school on this day and will grow awareness of intergenerational impacts of Residential Schools by observing Orange Shirt Day on Monday, September 29th. We are all treaty people and honour the healing journey of the survivors and their families. Please wear an orange shirt or item of clothing on Monday, September 29th. Every Child Matters.

LABELLING STUDENT BELONGINGS

We ask that all clothing and footwear have your child's name on it. This allows us to reunite lost clothing and avoids an overflowing lost and found. Please label shoes, jackets, mittens, etc. as this saves us time and you money!

Arriving on time and attending school regularly creates the foundation for future education and provides valuable time to socialize and create a greater sense of belonging.

HOW TO REPORT YOUR CHILD'S ABSENCE

You can report your child's absence with SchoolMessenger using one of the following methods, available 24 hour a day, seven days a week. Future absences can be reported at any time.

To create your account, please use the same email address and phone number that you use for PowerSchool

Using your existing PowerSchool Account

1. Log into the **PowerSchool** using your existing account
2. Click on the SchooMessenger icon in the left-hand menu to sign into the SchoolMessenger website.
3. Select the Attendance Menu, then Report an Absence.

On your mobile device:

1. On your mobile device, download and install the SchoolMessenger app from the **Apple App Store**, the **Google Play Store**.
2. When you open the app for the first time, select “Sign Up” to create your account.
3. Select Attendance, followed by “Report an Absence.”

Using the schoolMessenger website directly:

1. **Click on the SchoolMessenger website.** Upon your first visit, select “Sign Up” to create your account.
2. Select “Attendance,” then Report an Absence.”

By Telephone:

1. Call 1-833-788-7662 to report an absence using the automated phone system.

Please remember to keep your child home if they are feeling unwell, as recommended by AHS.



LEARNING WHILE ON VACATION

St. Timothy School recognizes that a child's educational experience is not confined to the school building and that vacation trips can be enlightening and valuable to a child's intellectual growth. Please keep in mind that the learning and teaching that is missed cannot easily be replicated outside the classroom or in a worksheet and your child may miss parts of the curriculum. Teachers structure their classes for both instruction and assessment according to the regulations established by the provincial government. Teachers are not required to provide assignments for vacations but could share topics being covered so you include them in your daily discussions. Google classrooms may allow for completion of assignments but opportunities for interaction and questions will be impacted as well as feedback for assessment. If you have any questions, please do not hesitate to call the school.

PARKING, DROP OFF and PICK UP

Parents/guardians who drop off or pick up students at school are asked to respect the signs on the street and at the entrance of the staff parking lot with regards to drop off, bus zones, parking, and handicapped access.

When crossing the street with your children, please choose safety over convenience and use the crosswalk.

We ask that you adhere to the following rules to keep all our students safe:

- You are not allowed to drop off your child in the bus zone.
- No drop offs or pick-ups are to happen in the crosswalk.
- No drop off or pick-ups are to happen in the staff parking lot.
- Please help your child understand the rules and walk with them to the patrolled crosswalk.
- Do not jay walk or encourage your child to jay walk.
- No U-turns in front of the school
- The staff parking lot is for the exclusive use of St. Timothy staff.
- Please respect the directions given by our staff supervisors
