
SCHOOL COUNCIL

REGISTRATION for the 2026-2027 SCHOOL YEAR

Students new to the division may apply online for the upcoming school year on Monday, February 2, 2026, at 9am. This includes new Kindergarten students who are eligible to register as long as they turn 5 on or before December 31, 2026. Parents new to the Division (no children currently registered in ECSD) will need to create a School Engage account prior to filling out the online application. Parents with children currently registered in ECSD can go directly to their parent portal and click on SchoolEngage to add a student and then fill out the application online.

LEARNING WHILE ON VACATION

St. Timothy School recognizes that a child's educational experience is not confined to the school building and that vacation trips can be enlightening and valuable to a child's intellectual growth. Please keep in mind that the learning and teaching that is missed cannot easily be replicated outside the classroom or in a worksheet and your child may miss parts of the curriculum. Teachers structure their classes for both instruction and assessment according to the regulations established by the provincial government. Teachers are not required to provide assignments for vacations but could share topics being covered so you include them in your daily discussions. Google classrooms may allow for completion of assignments but opportunities for interaction and questions will be impacted as well as feedback for assessment. If you have any questions, please do not hesitate to call the school.

PARKING, DROP OFF and PICK UP



Parents/guardians who drop off or pick up students at school are asked to respect the signs on the street and at the entrance of the staff parking lot with regards to drop off, bus zones, parking, and handicapped access.

When crossing the street with your children, please choose safety over convenience and use the crosswalk.

We ask that you adhere to the following rules to keep all our students safe:

- There is no parking in front of the school
- Do NOT enter the staff parking lot
- Walk on sidewalks at ALL times
- Do NOT make U-turns
- Use the crosswalk

COLD/WINTER WEATHER and APPROPRIATE DRESS

All students are expected to go outside for morning and lunch recess unless the weather is inclement, meaning rain or -20 degrees or colder with the wind chill. If it is inclement weather, the school will keep the students indoors. It is very important that all children dress appropriately for 15 to 20 minutes of outside activity, two times a day. Please label all items.



Morning teacher supervision starts at 8:10. Please do not drop off or allow your children to come to school before that time as there is no outdoor supervision.

DOGS ON SCHOOL GROUNDS

While we are a dog loving community, there are some safety considerations during drop off and pick up at school. If you are bringing your dog during these times, please ensure that you are in control of the dog and maintaining a safe distance from the students.
