Please use School Messenger to report your child's absences. You can do this through PowerSchool or calling 1-833-788-7662. Reporting by email becomes staff dependent and can result in an absence not being recorded. All absences need to be entered by 9 a.m. Thank you.



## **LEARNING WHILE ON VACATION**

St. Timothy School recognizes that a child's educational experience is not confined to the school building and that vacation trips can be enlightening and valuable to a child's intellectual growth. Please keep in mind that the learning and teaching that is missed cannot easily be replicated outside the classroom or in a worksheet and your child may miss parts of the curriculum. Teachers structure their classes for both instruction and assessment according to the regulations established by the provincial government. Teachers are not required to provide assignments for vacations but could share topics being covered so you include them in your daily discussions. Google classrooms may allow for completion of assignments but opportunities for interaction and questions will be impacted as well as feedback for assessment. If you have any questions, please do not hesitate to call the school.

## **PARKING, DROP OFF and PICK UP**

Parents/guardians who drop off or pick up students at school are asked to respect the signs on the street and at the entrance of the staff parking lot with regards to drop off, bus zones, parking, and handicapped access.

When crossing the street with your children, please choose safety over convenience and use the crosswalk.

**We ask that you adhere to the following rules to keep all our students safe:**

- You are not allowed to drop off your child in the bus zone.
- No drop-offs or pick-ups are to happen in the crosswalk.
- No drop-off or pick-ups are to happen in the staff parking lot.
- Please help your child understand the rules and walk with them to the patrolled crosswalk.
- Do not jay walk or encourage your child to jay walk.
- No U-turns in front of the school
- The staff parking lot is for the exclusive use of St. Timothy staff.
- Please respect the directions given by our School Staff on Supervision.

## **COLD/WINTER WEATHER and APPROPRIATE DRESS**

All students are expected to go outside for morning and lunch recess unless the weather is inclement, meaning rain or -20 degrees or colder with the wind chill. If it is inclement weather, the school will keep the students indoors. It is very important that all children dress appropriately for 15 to 20 minutes of outside activity, two times a day. Please label all items.

Morning teacher supervision starts at 8:10. Please do not drop off or allow your children to come to school before that time as there is no outdoor supervision.



## **DOGS ON SCHOOL GROUNDS**

While we are a dog loving community, there are some safety considerations during drop off and pick up at school. If you are bringing your dog during these times, please ensure that you are in control of the dog and maintaining a safe distance from the students.
